What is Forest of Dean Climate Action?

Working mission statement

Forest of Dean Climate Action is a partnership established to coordinate a district wide response to the climate emergency.


It will bring together communities, businesses and organisations from across the district to deliver joined up climate action through collaboration, empowerment and knowledge sharing, with the imperative of helping enable the district to become carbon neutral by 2030.

It will support rapid decarbonisation and the development of sustainable and resilient communities and enterprises, ensuring a just transition.

Background

- 2015 Paris Agreement keep rise in global heating to below 2C
- Preferably limit it to 1.5C
- Council declared Climate Emergency in December 2018
- Pledged to make Council and district carbon neutral by 2030
- Council is a key local agent but its influence is limited
- Requires a collaborative effort from all stakeholders

Forest of Dean District CO2 Emissions by Sector 2019/20



Forest of Dean Climate Action aims to help facilitate climate action beyond the control and means of Forest of Dean District Council

Adding Value – Joining up, scaling up and knowledge sharing

Leveraging the existing skills, knowledge and expertise within district via facilitation and coordination of:

- Knowledge sharing enabling ideas and initiatives to be replicated
- Connecting stakeholders enabling cross-sector initiatives
- Scaling up local initiatives where potential for district wide projects
- Public engagement identifying the potentially diverse needs and priorities of Forest of Dean residents, businesses and visitors

Progress so far

- Interim working group made up of council officers and volunteers
- Establishing relationships with stakeholder organisations:
 - Two Rivers Housing Forest Economic Partnership
 - Federation of Small Businesses Hartpury University and College
 - NFU Farming and Wildlife Advisory Group
 - CPRE The Countryside Charity Glos Wildlife Trust
 - Parish/Town Council Climate Groups Forest Voluntary Action Forum

Next steps

- Set up steering group of key stakeholders and appoint an interim chair
- Set core objectives and produce a medium term plan
- Identify initial projects and set up working groups
- Identify most appropriate way to incorporate and seek funding opportunities

Businesses - achieving carbon neutrality

Risks of inaction

- Physical risks climate impacts on buildings and supply chains
- Transitional risks lack of preparedness for changes in Govt policy, technology and market conditions
- Reputational risk not adapting to consumer and procurement preferences and expectations associated with climate change and fossil fuels
- Access to finance linked to all of the above

Opportunities of action

- Operational costs savings via energy efficiency, demand reduction, renewables
- Greater resilience and lower transition costs from planning and implementing risk management measures before risks materialise
- New markets innovation of low carbon products and services

Key questions for the FEP

- What are the current barriers to businesses taking action to reduce their carbon emissions?
- What do businesses need to overcome these barriers?
- How can Forest of Dean Climate Action help overcome barriers?
- Which key stakeholders/sectors within district would businesses find most useful to develop partnerships with?
- How can FEP and FoDCA collaborate and avoid duplication

Biosphere Reserve

- The Forest We Want sub-project
- Action Group looking:
 - Ways to take wider stakeholder engagement forward
 - Funding options to underpin the development project IF community and stakeholders in favour


Mobility as a Service (MaaS)

- Originally 5G testbed project opportunity;
- Now responds to
 - 34% of UK CO₂ caused by transport
 - Total UK CO₂ emissions down by 41% since 1990
 - Transport virtually unchanged tonnage of CO₂
 - No coincidence same timespan public transport ruined and car owner numbers increased.
- MaaS might be an economic solution to the problems caused by demise of petrol cars.
- Simply bookable shared transport for all.







Forest of Dean District Boundary Work Locations Journeys for work













Choice of transport






Using car less

- £650K outstanding to be distributed across this funding round
- No set amount per business
- Over £35M paid out since March 2020
